

# TOP SHORE SPOTS

## BROWN COUNTY

### Lily Lake

(Five miles east of Green Bay on Hwy 29 to Lily Lake Road / South 1 mile). Lily Lake has two piers with access to deep water. Pan fish and bass.

### Fox River

Voyager Park – (DePere west side of the river – ½ mile north of Claude Allouez Bridge on Hwy 57 and west 2 blocks to river).

Municipal Boat-landing – (East side of the river just west of Bay Beach Park at mouth of the river).

Both locations are popular spots for sheepshead, carp, catfish, northern pike, smallmouth bass, walleye and a few perch.

### Green Bay

Bay Shore Park – (about 10 miles north of Green Bay on Hwy 57). Turn left into the park and follow the road downhill to the breakwater. Perch, smallmouth bass, carp and catfish.

Duck Creek – (Velp Ave west from Bob's to Cty Rd J. Turn north on J, go ½ mile and park at boat landing). Walk a block north past the River's Bend Supper Club and fish the railroad bridge area. Bullheads and some perch.

Short piers on Duck Creek. (Velp Ave west from Bob's to the Military Street stop lights. Turn north. Turn west on the first road before the I-43 overpass. Go to dead end). Piers are a short way through the brush. Bullheads and some perch.

Duck Creek Slough – (North on Hwy 41 to Lineville Road. Turn left at top of off-ramp. Go to west side access road which runs parallel to Hwy 41. Go south past stop sign to the dead end). Bullheads and some perch.

Suamico Boat Landing – (North on Hwy 41 to Suamico/Sunset Beach exit. Turn right on Cty B and go 304 miles to boat landing. Bullheads, some perch and bluegills.

Reforestation Camp Large Pond – (North on Hwy 41 to Suamico/Sunset Beach exit. Go left on Cty B and follow the signs to Reforestation Camp). Trout, pan fish and maybe a few bass.

## KEWAUNEE COUNTY

### **Kewaunee Breakwater** – (Downtown Kewaunee).

Spring – Smelt (dip nets), trout (small smelt, Cleos, Mr. Champs and other spoons).

Summer – Not much going on. Occasional brown trout caught on spoons and crawlers.

\*\* The DNR is planting an exciting rainbow trout in 1999 that should stay shallow all summer. It could be good in about three years.

Fall – Starting in August, salmon and trout are within casting distance of the breakwater. Use spawn sacks or casting spoons.

**Algoma Breakwater** – (Downtown Algoma). Fish same as Kewaunee Breakwater listed above

### **Kewaunee River**

Bruemmer Park – (Four miles west of Kewaunee just off of Cty C on Hwy F). Spring and fall for trout and salmon.

Footbridge (Kewaunee River) – (Four miles west of Kewaunee on Cty C). Spring and fall for trout and salmon.

Summer – Smallmouth and catfish at both locations.

**East Alaska/West Alaska** (off of Cty D near Hwy 42 intersection).

**Krohn's Lake** – on Cty KK just off Cty K about 2-3 miles west of Algoma.

All have piers. You might have to put up with swimmers on Krohn's and West Alaska. Pier fishing for pan fish and bass in all three lakes. In addition, Krohn's has trout and East Alaska has muskies.

**Kewaunee Nuclear Plant** – (About 7 miles south of Kewaunee on Hwy 42)

Cement platform

**Point Beach Nuclear Plant** – (About 9 miles south of Kewaunee on Hwy 42).

Steel grate platform.

Both are excellent for brown trout November through April.

## DOOR COUNTY

**Stone Quarry** – (Go to downtown Sturgeon Bay on Business 42. Cross the bridge go until you meet Cty B. Take B north about 5 miles to the stone quarry). This is one of the finest smallmouth bass shore spots anywhere. Perch and northern can also be caught.

**Sturgeon Bay Canal** – This area has an excellent salmon run in the fall. Fish the breakwater leading to Lake Michigan and the water plant. Ask the locals for directions.

**Forestville Dam** and lake above the dam – (Hwy 42 north of Algoma about 10 miles). Below the dam has good fishing in the spring and fall for trout and salmon. Above the dam there is a grass area and pier. Northern, bass and pan fish can be caught above the dam.

There can be excellent shore fishing in the Door County Harbors during spring, summer and fall. Ask us for details.

## MARINETTE COUNTY

**Menominee River** – (About 50 miles north of Green Bay on Hwy 41 to the river). Fish the Hatti Street walkway near the dam. There are piers, a park and boat landings on either side of the river. You can fish either the Michigan or Wisconsin side with a Wisconsin fishing license. Walleye, smallmouth bass and pan fish are most common along with musky, northern and sturgeon.

## OCONTO COUNTY

**Oconto Breakwater** – (take Hwy 41 north to Oconto). Turn right at the first stoplight and go through Oconto. When you are past all the houses (about 1-2 miles) watch for Harbor Road. Turn right and drive to the breakwater. Perch, catfish, northern, smallmouth bass and walleye.

**Machickanee Flowage and Oconto River** – (North on Hwy 41/141 about 33 miles. Stay on Hwy 141. Cross the Oconto River at Stiles, turn left and go to dead end. You can see the river to the south).

Walk up the hill to fish the Machickanee (above the dam). Game fish and pan fish.

Below the dam is the Oconto River and is considered a Great Lakes Area and a Great Lakes Stamp is required to take trout and salmon. Bluegills, bass, walleye and crappie are also caught. This is a great river to wade. Sprint and fall runs of salmon and trout can be good.
